Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping



The journey continues in Aachen for Henrik von Eckermann!

The Rolex Grand Slam is unique in the world of the professional riders, because it unites the four Majors with each other: CHIO Aachen, Spruce Meadows, CHI Geneva and The Dutch Masters in 's-Hertogenbosch. The four Rolex Grand Prix staged there are alone endowed with prize-money totalling 5 million Euros – and on top of this the riders also have the opportunity of picking up a bonus. However, high amounts of prize-money are by no means the sole criteria for being part of the Rolex Grand Slam. Further factors such as tradition and large crowds, media presence and the infrastructure of the shows also have to be top level. A further element of the Rolex Grand Slam is the targeted promotion of aspiring young talents.

The system of the Rolex Grand Slam is simple: The rider, who succeeds in winning three shows in succession, receives 1 million Euros in addition to the prize-money. If the rider subsequently also claims the victory in the fourth Major in a row, he collects a further bonus of 1 million Euros. Anyone, who wins two out of four Majors

also picks up a bonus. If the shows are won in direct succession, the bonus totals 500,000 Euros. If the athlete is successful in the "two-out-of-four mode", but not at two consecutive shows, the bonus amounts to 250,000 Euros.

It is always the rider, who counts, in terms of winning the bonus, which means it is also possible to do so riding different horses. This system is not coupled with a calendar year, it is infinite.

At the CHIO Aachen 2019, the focus particularly lies on two show-jumpers: Because the Egyptian rider Sameh El Dahan and Sweden's Henrik von Eckermann could write history with a victory in the Rolex Grand Prix, the Grand Prix of Aachen. Von Eckermann, because he can continue his personal Grand Slam after his triumph in 's-Hertogenbosch in the Netherlands and El Dahan, because he has his sights set on the "two-out-of-four" bonus. El Dahan namely rode to victory at Spruce Meadows in September.

This is where the equestrian sport stars of tomorrow compete against each other: The best aspiring young show-jumpers have been taking part in the Salut Festival at the Soers in Aachen for over a quarter of a century. Here in four age groups they battle it out to see who claims the victories in the Grand Prix and the Indoor Champion titles.



In 2017, the organisers have added another spectacular weekend to the show calendar of the aspiring young athletes: The "Aachen Youngstars 2019" starts with the best international young dressage riders who will compete during the "Aachen Dressage Youngstars" from November 28th to December 1st. One week later (December 5th to 8th, 2019), the show-jumpers will travel to Aachen again to show their skills at the "Aachen Jumping Youngstars – Salut Festival".

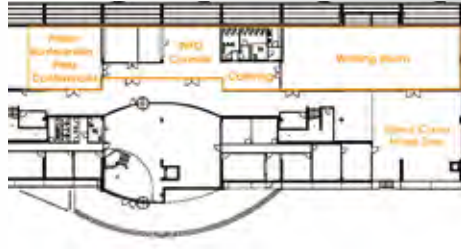

The press seats in all three stadiums as well as in the Albert-Vahle-Arena will have stickers with "Presse/Media" on them.

Press Conferences

Press Conferences will be held subsequent to all main competitions in the Press Conference Room (Vaulting: in the Sub Press Centre, only on Sunday evening, July 14th). The current schedule will be posted in the Press Centre.

National & international TV-Teams

Mixed Zones

Short interviews with the athletes can be made at the edges of the training/warm-up areas. Longer interviews can be made at the Mixed-Zones. Mixed-Zone Jumping: "SAP Riders' Corner" / Mixed-Zone Dressage: "Riders' Plaza".

Lockers

Lockers are available in limited numbers at the Main Press Centre (as of Monday, July 15th). Keys can be obtained at the counter (deposit of 20 Euros). The use of the lockers is at one's own risk.

Dresscode

TV Teams, photographers and media representatives that enter the stadiums' infield areas are requested to follow the dress code. Please avoid shorts and sleeveless tops as well as sponsor brandings on clothing.

Information for Photographers

Photographer Bibs

After consultation with the photo coordinator, it is allowed to enter the stadium infield with a photographer bib. Upon request, the bibs can be obtained (20 Euro deposit) at the counter of the Press Centre, they are allocated on the basis of a rotation principle. There is no guarantee that each photographer will receive a bib.

Photographer Positions

The photographer positions will be defined in consultation with the Technical Delegates and the course designers. Photographer positions will be posted previous to the competitions in the Press Centre.

Prize Giving Ceremonies

During the prize giving ceremonies, it is not allowed to trespass the barriers in the stadium infield. Please follow the instructions of our press team at all times.

Cross-country & Marathon Day

On the cross-country & marathon day, there will be selected photographer positions alongside the course. Photographers with a bib are allowed to move at the outer edge of the track.

Ban of remote controls without CE-labels

In Germany it is forbidden to use remote controls (so-called Pocket Wizards) WITHOUT a CE-label.

Use of remote cameras

The use of remote cameras will only be approved after prior agreement with the course designer. Only a limited number of remote cameras will be approved, the approval of cameras with sound insulation will be preferred.

1.) SAP-Cup

Dressage Test (Day 1, Friday, 19th July 2019):



The eventers and their horses have to accomplish their first competition in the 20 x 60 metre sand dressage arena in the Deutsche Bank Stadium. Three judges, the so-called „Ground Jury“, mark the movements that have to be completed, from different positions around the arena (C, H and B). A maximum of 10 points can be awarded for each of the movements, which differ from each other in their complexity - among others the obedience of the horse, the precision, the movements of the horse as well as the rider's seat and correctness of aids are evaluated. Test to be absolved from memory: FEI 2015 3* B

The mean value ensuing from the assessment of the three judges expresses the quality of the ride and is displayed to the spectators as a percentage. In addition - unlike in the specialised field of dressage - this result is then converted into minus points, which can later be added together to form the end result after the jumping and cross-country competitions. The respective judge calculates the minus points as follows: (Percentage -100) x 1.5 The co-efficient 1.5 was laid down by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI).



2.) SAP-Cup Jumping Test (Day 1, Friday, 19th July 2019):



The eventers at the CHIO Aachen already ride into the Main Stadium with its capacity of 40,000 spectators on the afternoon of the first day. A course of max. 600 metres and 11 to 12 obstacles with the maximum height of 1.25 metres has to be absolved.

3.) SAP-Cup Cross-Country Test (Day 2, Saturday, 20th July 2019)



Traditionally actually held as the second of the three competitions, in Aachen the cross-country phase -in the modern CIC format- will bring the eventing discipline to a spectacular close. The cross-country track, built by Rüdiger Schwarz, is 3,990 metres long and leads through the meadows of the Aachen Soers, directly next to the CHIO show grounds - so the spectators can easily reach it on foot. The competition's start takes place in the Soers meadows, the finishing line is located inside the CHIO's Main Stadium

After dressage and jumping, the penalty points are added, they are decisive for the starting order of the cross country competition. The 20 best riders start last. The competition has to be accomplished within a predetermined time (ideal average time 570 m/minute), and time penalties are added to the result for exceeding time (0.4 for every commenced second). 25 natural obstacles have to be jumped by the horses and their riders with nearly 35 efforts (single jumps). In comparison to the specialised sport of show jumping, not only the height and width of the obstacles are different, but the eventing horses and riders are also confronted with further difficulties that challenge the mutual trust and the balance, this can be optical aspects (narrow obstacles, brightness changes between dark and light passages, water obstacles) or the course's route (e.g. uphill/downhill). It is customary to offer an alternative route for difficult phases of demanding courses - as is the case in Aachen. The alternative route is easier to overcome and thus minimises the risk of the horse refusing, but it is longer than the direct way and thus takes more time.

The penalty points incurred in all three competition parts are added together for the final result. The competitor with the lowest total of penalty points wins.

France is guest of honour at the Aachen Soers



The Emperor's city Aachen and the "Grande Nation", France, enjoy close ties. The latest example: Earlier this year on January 22nd, the Elysée Treaty on German/French cooperation and integration was renewed after 56 years here at this location steeped in history, namely the "Aachen Treaty" was sealed. It was an historical moment when the Federal Chancellor Angela Merkel and France's President, Emmanuel Macron, placed their signatures under the treaty. A few months later, a new leaf in this chapter of friendship will turn over: At the CHIO Aachen 2019, as the

official partner country, France will prove that it certainly lives up to its name as a "horse nation". Not only top French riders will be travelling to the World Equestrian Festival this year, but also numerous performers, who will co-shape the event programme over the ten days of the show. For example, the spectacular "Horse & Symphony" concert will be characterised by the meanwhile 17th partner country together with the Opening Ceremony on the evening of July 16th, which commences at 8.00 p.m.

The traditional Opening Ceremony in the Main Stadium has established itself as the perfect entertainment show for the past four years – a spectacular 90-minute long, floodlit pageant. In the case of this year's edition, the spectators can look forward to a colourful, magnificent and spectacular show. The entire performance will be a colourful review of the French lifestyle and art of living, traditions won't get a raw deal here either. Horse racing also has a long history in France. And regardless of whether flat racing or Trotters: Fashion always plays a major role on racing days. Also on board: The magnificent, mounted guards of the Republic – a cavalry regiment, whose tasks include among others protecting the French President – as well as the fantastic horses and riders of the most famous French riding school, the "Cadre Noir". It is certainly going to be impressive when their world-famous representatives enter the Main Stadium of the CHIO Aachen. 40,000 spectators will bid the approx. 30 riders in their parade uniforms a memorable welcome. Around 1,000 extras and several hundred horses will be participating in total – among others a herd of Camargue horses is awaited, flanked by riders, stilt walkers and air acrobats. Hunt horsemen together with their pack of hounds will ride through the arena accompanied by hunting horn players. Of course, the world-famous French breeding tradition will also play a major role.



However, France will also demonstrate what it has to offer as a tourist and cultural destination. One should definitely visit the "Rue France", a large exhibition area in the heart of the CHIO Aachen Village. Here, a 15-metre high Eiffel Tower can be admired, inter alia.

People and Horses

- According to a survey by Allensbacher Markt- & Werbeträgeranalyse (AWA/Allensbacher Markt & Advertising Analysis) in 2016 around 14 million respondents stated that they were interested in riding. Around 4 million were even particularly interested in this sport. Whereby exclusively over-14 year olds were interviewed. The survey also determined the number of riders in Germany: 3.89 million people refer to themselves as riders. 1.25 million people practise the sport intensively. 78 percent of them are women. Furthermore, there are approx. 900,000 horse owners in Germany.
- According to the projections of the FN, which are based on various surveys and figures, such as for instance the IPSOS survey, the animal diseases fund and the Allensbacher Markt- und Werbeträgeranalyse (AWA), approx. 1.3 million horses live in Germany.

Organised Horse Sport in Germany

(All of the subsequent figures relate to the year 2018)

- The German Equestrian Federation (Fédération Equestre Nationale/FN), the overall national association of equestrian sports, is the world's largest horse sport association. Within the German Olympic Sports Confederation (DOSB), the German National Federation is on rank 8 with 686.747 members (previous year: 687.036).
- Equestrian sport is very popular with females: About 79 % of the FN members (540.690) are girls and women while the male group is much smaller with 146.057 members.
- Most of the members are registered in the regional association of Westphalia (98.534), followed by Westfalen (98.203), Bavaria (92.506), Hannover (81.815), Hesse (69.405) and Rhineland (58.988). If Westphalia and Rhineland were added, North Rhine-Westphalia would have 157.191 and Lower Saxony (Hannover/Bremen and Weser-Ems) 131.029 club members.

Organisational Structure of the German Equestrian Federation (FN)

- The "Deutsche Reiterliche Vereinigung e. V. (FN)" is the umbrella organisation for 17 regional horse sport organisations with 7.364 riding and driving clubs. The breeding sector comprises 25 German breeding organisations whose focus is laid on breeding the German Warmblood Horse.
- Directly affiliated to the FN (or its associated organisations) are also 3.702 commercial horse centres and 58.951 personal members.
- Further member associations are Deutsches Olympiade-Komitee für Reiterei e. V. /DOKR (German Olympic Committee for Equestrian Sport), Deutscher Reiter- und Fahrer-Verband e. V. (German Riders' and Drivers' Association) and Deutsche Richtervereinigung e. V. (German Judges' Association) plus nine affiliated associations: Westernreiter Union Deutschland e. V. (Western riding), Island Pferde-, Reiter- und Züchterverband e. V. (riders and breeders of Iceland horses), Verein Deutscher Distanzreiter- und -fahrer e. V. (Endurance riders and drivers), Deutsches Kuratorium für Therapeutisches Reiten e. V. (Therapeutic riding), Deutscher Akademischer Reiterverband e. V. (University riders), Internationale Gangpferde-Vereinigung e. V. (Gaited horses) and Bundesverband für klassisch-barocke Reiterei Deutschland (Baroque riding), Verein Deutscher Hengsthalter (persons who own/keep stallions) and Deutsche Jungzüchter (young breeders).



Competition Sport

In the year 2018,

- 3.575 (previous year: 3.619) equestrian events with 68.001 (previous year: 69.481) competitions and 1.378.244 (previous year: 1.431.453) starts were run. Prize-money reached 2018 a sum of 32.701.454 (previous year: 32.449.673) Euro.
- the FN issued 81.344 (previous year: 82.983) annual licences which are needed to be eligible for competing. 1.564 thereof (previous year: 1.534) were licences for foreign riders competing in German national events. Moreover, 6.848 adolescents and adults got their first competition experience with a trial licence (previous year: 9.291).
- the FN updated licences for 135.133 (previous year: 137.806) competition horses and issued 2.387 (previous year: 2.539) new FEI passports for horses competing internationally. 21.186 (previous year: 21.758) of these competition horses were registered for the first time.
- 55,19 % of all competition horses were aged 5 to 10, 27,73 % were aged 11 to 15. 7,53 % of the horses were 3 to 4 years old, another 9,56 % were 16 years or over.

German Horse Breeding

German studbooks have a significant share in the success of German horse sport.

- In 2018, 3.023 (previous year: 2.997) riding horse sires and 53.490 (previous year: 52.757) riding horse brood mares as well as a total of 26.300 (previous year: 25.255) riding horse foals were registered. The number of coverings of warmblood mares slightly increased to 31.864 in comparison to 31.733 in 2017. This is a surplus of 0,4 %.
- Summing up all horse and pony breeds of the 25 studbooks affiliated to the FN, from Akhal-Teke to Tinker, the following stock of breeder animals was reported in 2018: 7.544 stallions (previous year 7.610), 81.140 brood mares (previous year: 80.416) and 38.298 foals (previous year: 37.080).
- In addition, we recorded 3.385 pony and small horse stallions of all breeds (previous year: 3.439) 19.589 pony and small horse brood mares (previous year: 19.568) and 8.432 foals (previous year: 8.336).
- In 2018, 172 riding horse stallions (previous year: 181) passed the 14-day performance test for stallions; 95 stallions (previous year: 72) underwent the 50-day performance test. 2.697 brood mares (previous year: 2.759) gave proof of their performance capability in stationary and field tests.
- The German horses dominated the medal-awarding ceremonies in Tryon in the three Olympic disciplines. For example, 19 of the total 45 four-legged medal winners in the dressage, show jumping and eventing competitions were German-bred. Across all seven disciplines, which were awarded medals in Tryon, this makes up a share of 29 percent. The German horses picked up the most medals in the jumping classes – in total ten of the possible 15 medals. In the dressage, German-bred horses won eight of the possible 15 medals, four of these were indeed gold medals. In the eventing only one German horse made the medal ranking at the Championships.
- At the 2014 World Equestrian Games in Caen, German-bred horses claimed 48 of the possible 192 medals (25 percent).



Horses – The Economic Factor

- For more than 10,000 companies, craftsman's establishments and service providers in Germany, the horse is their direct or indirect main subject of business activity.
- The turnover of the German horse industry is about 6.7 billion Euros. These include 39 % of the expenditure on equestrian management and 61 % on retail and services.
- At the 2018 horse sale auctions of the studbooks, 783 riding horses were sold at an average price of 25.090 Euro. The total turnover at these auctions was 19.645.701 Euro (previous year: 921 riding horses, average price 24.240 Euro, total turnover 22.325.111 Euro). Furthermore, around 1.700 breeding horses and foals as well as ponies and heavy draught horses were auctioned by the studbooks. Thus 2.629 horses and ponies changed ownership on studbook auction sales.

Aachen without horses? Unthinkable.

The horse belongs to Aachen like the port does to Hamburg, like the Brandenburger Tor does to Berlin. The foundation of the city goes back to a horse. In Aachen this can, of course, only have been the horse of Charlemagne. It is said that his horse once pawed the earth with his hoof and thereby discovered the famous hot Aachen springs during a hunting trip. This was the beginning of Aachen's career as Charlemagne's favourite palace and as a spa and bathing city.

The people in Aachen call such stories „Ameröllche“. When they talk about the famous annual horse show at the city's gates in the Soers, they say „Tschio“. If you pronounced the tournament's title correctly you would say „C - H - I - O“. The „Concours Hippique International Officiel“ is the world's most renowned equestrian event. Every year the world's best riders and drivers meet in the Soers to compete in front of an audience of more than 350,000 visitors. The show is famous for its extraordinarily fair and euphoric audience, the top level sport and its atmosphere which is similar to a folk festival.

But Aachen is associated with much more than only top international horse sport. Almost 150 equestrian companies, 22 indoor arenas, dozens of riding clubs and over 40 kilometres of riding tracks form a perfect infrastructure for riding as popular sport within the city's environs. So it is not a surprise that Aachen, situated in the border triangle with Belgium and the Netherlands, was awarded the title "Horse Friendly Community" in 2002. Aachen's high identification with the horse and equestrian sports can be found in many places in the city.

The famous horse sculpture of Bonifatius Stirnberg welcomes travellers at the main train station, and near the city theatre stands the Smiling Stallion of Gerhard Marcks. Located in the centre of Europe, the city of the International Charlemagne Prize is also a science centre of international reputation. Aachen Cathedral and Treasury

The Aachen “Dom” (Cathedral), which has been given the status of a world cultural heritage site, is the former Palace Chapel of Charlemagne. Still today, this magnificent building fascinates visitors who gaze upwards to the 32 meters high dome and admire the Barbarossa chandelier (1180), the shrines of Charlemagne and Mary (13th century) as well as the legendary throne of Charlemagne. This is the historic site of the coronation of more than 30 German kings (from 936 to 1531). The gothic choir of the cathedral with its 27 meters high windows (1414) is a masterpiece of its time. The adjacent Treasury exhibits another 100 works of sacral art such as the famous bust of Charlemagne (approx. 1349). (www.aachendom.de)



City Hall



The City Hall, the first stop on the “Route Charlemagne”, was built on the foundations of the former main hall of Charlemagne’s palace. Today, it is a place of Europe’s living past where you can view an interactive exhibition with the help of an “Aixplorer” audio-visual guide to get a first-hand feel for the history – past and present – of this building, the city and Europe as well. Opposite the city hall, in Haus Löwenstein, there is an exhibition on the planned “Route Charlemagne”.

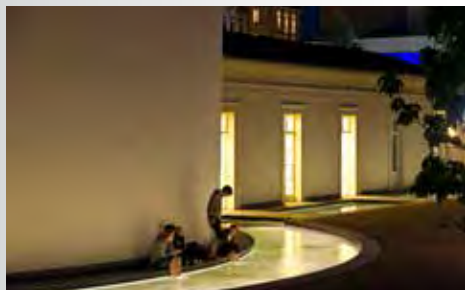
Historic Old Town

Aachen’s Old Town has a lot of flair – atmospheric lanes and alleyways, numerous shops, pubs, cafés and restaurants invite visitors to stroll and window-shop. The people of Aachen and their guests enjoy the Mediterranean ambience of the city and its historic buildings and picturesque burgher houses. The spa city of Aachen is also the city of fountains and sculptures. Puppet Fountain, Chicken Thief, Fish Pond, Türelüre-Liðje or Karls Fountain – the wide variety of Aachen fountains on their own make a rewarding tour.





Elisenbrunnen / Elisenpark



As early as Roman times, the hot thermal springs (approx. 38-74°C) have made Aachen a well-known spa for rheumatic ailments. A representation of the former glamorous spa and bathing city is the Elisa Fountain with its magnificent colonnades that was built from 1822 to 1828 according to the plans of Karl Friedrich Schinkel. Take your time to study the marble plaques with the names of the celebrities of past centuries. The 2013 opened "Archaeological Showcase" offers views into 5.000 years of Aachen's

Couven-Museum

The Couven-Museum is also called "Aachen's most famous living room". Situated in a beautiful 17th century building right in the historic centre of Aachen, it shows the development of the style of living of the 18th and 19th century. The rooms display a harmonious ensemble of several middle class furniture styles from Rococo to the early Classicism of Louis-Seize, the Napoleonic empire style and Biedermeier. International Newspaper Museum



The International Newspaper Museum newly opened in 2011: the Newspaper Museum occupies an imposing 15th century house and is home to one of the 21st century's most up-to-the-minute international media presentations. It vividly conveys media literacy in a contemporary style, showing approximately 200,000 newspapers published over a period of 500 years. (www.izm.de)

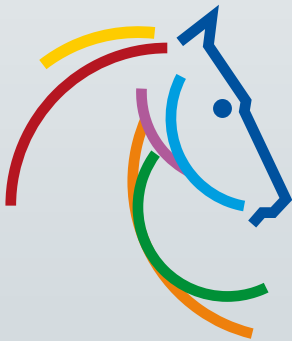
