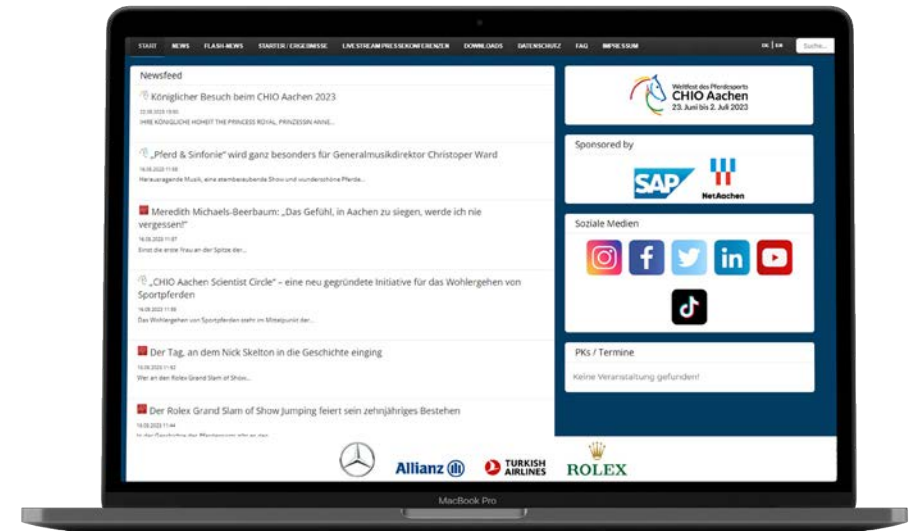

Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping

The Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping is celebrating an anniversary: 10 years of world-class jumping sport. 10 years full of memorable moments and emotions. 10 years in which Scott Brash (GBR) is the only rider, who has succeeded in mastering the ultimate challenge. In 2013, the Rolex Grand Slam celebrated its premiere in Aachen. And now the biggest challenge of the equestrian sport is returning to the place where it all began 10 years ago. The concept of the series: Unique. Spectacular. Ultimate. Since it unites the Majors in Aachen (GER), Geneva (SUI), Spruce Meadows (CAN) and 's-Hertogenbosch (NED) into one contest for the most prestigious trophy on the international equestrian sport circuit. Four shows in a class of their own, four epic arenas steeped in tradition, a huge challenge – designed for the best riders and horses in the world. Whoever triumphs at three of these shows in succession, wins the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping and picks up additional prize money to the value of one million Euros.

Coinciding with the anniversary, we have a rider from the USA, McLain Ward, who could possibly pull off the extremely difficult feat of claiming the Rolex Grand Slam trophy at the CHIO Aachen. After his sensational victories in Geneva and 's-Hertogenbosch, the 47-year-old has the ultimate chance in Aachen to tread in Scott Brash's footsteps. "Mastering this challenge is what all riders strive to do," the current title contender explained. If the US-American manages to win the Rolex Grand Prix at the CHIO Aachen as well, a new chapter will be written in the glorious history of the Rolex Grand Prix of Show Jumping.

Daniel Deuber (GER) is a further rider, who also has an opportunity in Aachen to pick up a valuable bonus in the prestigious series. The 42-year-old, who rode to victory in the Major in Calgary in September 2022, has the prospect of earning himself a 250,000-Euro bonus at the CHIO Aachen for two non-consecutive victories within his Grand Slam cycle.

Shows for young talents 2023 – free admission!

Aachen Youngstars 2023

This is where the equestrian sport stars of tomorrow compete: The Aachen Soers has been welcoming the best talented young show-jumpers to the Salut Festival for over 30 years. Here, they battle it out for the victories in the Grand Prix and to claim the title of Indoor Champion in four age groups.



In 2017, the organisers extended the show calendar for the young athletes to include a further spectacular weekend. In the scope of the "Aachen Dressage Youngstars" an international dressage show for young dressage riders has been initiated, which once again this year together with the "Aachen Jumping Youngstars – Salut-Festival" forms the "Aachen Youngstars".

International dressage talents will kick off the event from November 30th – December 3rd. The best German show-jumpers will then have the opportunity to demonstrate their skills one week later from December 7th – 10th, 2023.

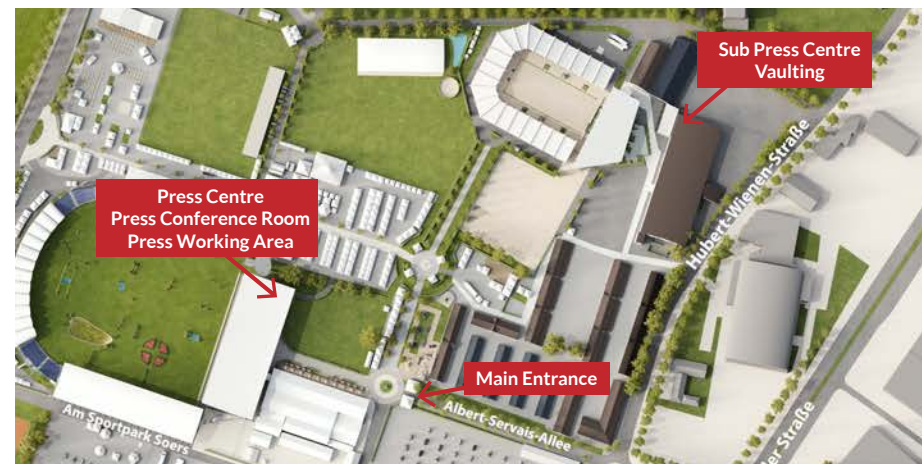

Note for photographers

Photographer Bibs

People wearing a photographer bib are allowed to stand inside the stadium after consultation with the photographer coordinator. The bib can be collected from the Counter of the Press Centre on request following a rotation principle in exchange for a deposit of 20 Euros. No entitlement to a bib exists.

Photographer Positions

The photographer positions will be laid down in consultation with the technical delegates and the course builders. The photographer positions will be posted on the notice boards in the Press Centre prior to the competitions.

Prize-Giving Ceremonies

The barriers inside the stadium are not allowed to be passed during any of the prize-giving ceremonies. The instructions of the press team must be obeyed by at all times.

Cross-Country Day

There are selected photographer positions on the track on the cross-country day. Photographers wearing bibs are allowed to move around on the outer perimeter of the track.

Ban on radio triggers without a CE label.

The use of radio triggers (so-called pocket wizards) WITHOUT a CE label is forbidden in Germany..

Use of remote cameras

The use of remote cameras will only be approved after prior consultation with the course designer. Only a very limited number of remote cameras will be approved, cameras with sound insulation will be given preference.

People and Horses

- According to a survey by the market research company, IPSOS, in 2019, around 11.2 million respondents stated that they were interested in horses and the equestrian sport. Whereby only over 14-year-olds were interviewed. The survey also determined the number of equestrian athletes in Germany: 2.32 million people describe themselves as riders*, including 840,000 regularly active riders and 1.48 million occasional riders. 700,000 people would like to ride or return to the sport.
- Furthermore, there are around 600,000 households in Germany that own horses as well as 920,000 households with a horse-sharing participation. According to projections, the number of horses privately-owned is around 1.25 million. Just under a third are kept privately, the majority (around 45 percent) are kept in livery stables. The remainder live on farms without a riding area or indoor school.
- According to the IPSOS survey, regularly active riders are predominantly female (78 percent), on average 38 years old, well-educated and mostly work full-time or at least part-time. For most people, the close relationship to the horse and the closeness to nature are their reasons for riding. Most riders live in towns with less than 100,000 inhabitants. The smallest share lives in big cities. The net household income is in some cases significantly lies over the German average.

Organised Horse Sport in Germany

The following figures apply for the year 2022:

- The German Equestrian Federation (Fédération Equestre Nationale, FN), the national umbrella association for equestrian sport, is the largest equestrian sport association in the world. With 664,919 members (previous year 664,512), the FN ranks eighth within the German Sports Federation (DOSB).
- The equestrian sport is extremely popular with the female sex. 533,136 of the FN members are girls or women. Comprising of 131,783 members, the male share is significantly lower.
- With a total of 97,094 members (previous year: 97,022) the District Association of Baden-Württemberg has the most members, followed by Westphalia with 95,890 members (previous year: 95,450), Bavaria with 85,491 (previous year: 86,544), Hanover with 78,944 (previous year: 78,983), Hesse with 69,109 (previous year: 67,944) and Rhineland with 57,199 members (57,451). Adding the figures from Westphalia and Rhineland together, the number of members in North Rhine-Westphalia totals 153,089 and for Lower Saxony (Hanover/Bremen and Weser-Ems) 126,135 association members.

Organisational Structure of the German Equestrian Federation (FN)

- 17 district equestrian sport associations comprising of 7,278 riding and driving clubs (previous year: 7,289) belong to the German Equestrian Federation (FN), the umbrella association. 25 German breeding associations belong to the breeding division, 15 of which focus mainly on the warmblood breed.
- Furthermore, 3,389 equestrian establishments (previous year: 3,429) and 56,960 personal members (previous year 57,853) are directly affiliated to the FN (or its member associations).
- The German Olympic Equestrian Committee (DOKR) and the German Riding and Driving Association

as well as the German Associations of Judges for Horse Performance Tests are further FN member associations. There are nine additional affiliated associations: The German Western Riders Union Germany, The Icelandic Horse, Rider and Breeder Association, the Association of German Endurance Riders and Drivers, the German Curatorship for Therapeutic Riding, German Academic Riding Association, International Gaited Horses Association, Federal Association for Classic Baroque Horses Germany, Association German of Stallion Owners and the German Young Breeders.

Competition Sport

- 3,562 (previous year: 2,652) shows with 59,054 classes (previous year: 41,716) and 1,111,842 individual starts (previous year: 858,654) were held in the year 2022. The prize-money in 2022 amounted to 29,928,312 Euros (previous year: 21,378,133). This compares to 3,567 shows in 2019, before the Corona pandemic, with 66,281 classes over about 1.34 million starts.
- In 2022, the FN issued 71,831 annual riders' licences, which entitle the holders to participate at shows (previous year: 64,401); of which 1,442 licences were for foreign riders (previous year: 1,342), who took part at German shows. Prior to Corona, the last count was 80,342 annual riders' licences. In addition to this, 5,230 youths and adults found their way into competition sport via so-called trial licences (previous year: 4,342, 2019: 6,077).
- In 2022, the FN issued renewals (competition licences) for 120,453 competition horses and ponies (previous year: 109,586, 2019: 132,257) as well as 2,929 FEI passes for horses competing at international level (previous year: 2,689, 2019: 2,572). These include 22,654 horses and ponies that were entered into the show horse register for the first time (Previous year: 20,536).
- In 2022, the share of older horses in the sport rose again. 29.54 percent (2019: 29.35) were aged between 11 and 15 and 10.93 percent (2019: 9.86) were even over 16 – with an upward trend. Horses aged between two and five still make up the biggest share of all show horses – 50.38 percent (2019: 52.71). Unlike in previous years the share of younger horses has increased slightly again. 9.15 percent (previous year 9.63) of the show horses were three and four-year-olds, which is no doubt attributable to the fact that the horse breeding figures have risen again.

German Horse Breeding

- The German riding horse and riding pony breeding programme contributes considerably to the success of the German equestrian sport.
- 2,973 breeding stallions (previous year: 2,781) as well as 54,041 brood mares (previous year: 53,306) as well as a total of 28,173 foals (previous year: 27,120) were registered in the year 2022. Whereby the number of covers has decreased minimally from 30,654 in the year 2021 down to 30,894 in total.
- Furthermore, in 2022 overall 3,815 pony and small horse stallions of all breeds (previous year: 3,531), 21,089 pony and small horse brood mares (previous year: 20,370) as well as 10,498 foals (previous year: 9,337) were registered with the associations.
- The following numbers of breeding animals for all horse and pony breeds registered with the 25 FN affiliated breeding associations (from Akhal Teke through to the Warlander) were reported for 2022: 8,219 stallions (previous year 8,339), 83,855 brood mares (previous year: 85,849) and 42,320 foals (previous year: 39,877).
- In 2022, 226 riding stallions completed the 14-day test (previous year 94). 117 stallions took part in the 50-day stallion performance test (previous year: 150). 116 graded stallions (previous year 134) completed the sport test. 1,778 brood mares (previous year: 1,843) demonstrated their ability in performance and field tests.



Horses – The Economic Factor

- Over 10,000 companies, handicraft businesses and service companies in Germany are directly or indirectly dependent on the horse as their main line of business.
- The turnover of the German horse industry lies at an estimated 6.7 billion Euros. The area horse keeping accounts for 39 percent of the expenditure (2.6 bil. Euros), the area retail trade and services account for 61 percent (4.1 bil. Euros).
- 756 riding horses were auctioned off for an average price of 28,735 at the riding horse auctions of the breeding associations in the year 2022. The overall turnover of these auctions totalled 21,723,750 Euros (previous year: 783 riding horses, average price 29,874 Euros, overall turnover 23,391,577 Euros). In addition, around 1,789 breeding horses and foals as well as ponies and draught horses (previous year: 1,917) were sold at auctions of the breeding associations.

The City of Aachen

Aachen without horses? Unthinkable.

The horse belongs to Aachen like the port does to Hamburg, like the Brandenburger Tor does to Berlin. The foundation of the city goes back to a horse. In Aachen this can, of course, only have been the horse of Charlemagne. It is said that his horse once pawed the earth with his hoof and thereby discovered the famous hot Aachen springs during a hunting trip. This was the beginning of Aachen's career as Charlemagne's favourite palace and as a spa and bathing city.

The people in Aachen call such stories „Ameröllche“. When they talk about the famous annual horse show at the city's gates in the Soers, they say „Tschio“. If you pronounced the tournament's title correctly you would say „C – H – I – O“. The „Concours Hippique International Officiel“ is the world's most renowned equestrian event. Every year the world's best riders and drivers meet in the Soers to compete in front of an audience of more than 350,000 visitors. The show is famous for its extraordinarily fair and euphoric audience, the top level sport and its atmosphere which is similar to a folk festival.





The City of Aachen

But Aachen is associated with much more than only top international horse sport. Almost 150 equestrian companies, 22 indoor arenas, dozens of riding clubs and over 40 kilometres of riding tracks form a perfect infrastructure for riding as popular sport within the city's environs. So it is not a surprise that Aachen, situated in the border triangle with Belgium and the Netherlands, was awarded the title "Horse Friendly Community" in 2002. Aachen's high identification with the horse and equestrian sports can be found in many places in the city.

The famous horse sculpture of Bonifatius Stirnberg welcomes travellers at the main train station, and near the city theatre stands the Smiling Stallion of Gerhard Marcks. Located in the centre of Europe, the city of the International Charlemagne Prize is also a science centre of international reputation. Aachen Cathedral and Treasury

The Aachen "Dom" (Cathedral), which has been given the status of a world cultural heritage site, is the former Palace Chapel of Charlemagne. Still today, this magnificent building fascinates visitors who gaze upwards to the 32 meters high dome and admire the Barbarossa chandelier (1180), the shrines of Charlemagne and Mary (13th century) as well as the legendary throne of Charlemagne. This is the historic site of the coronation of more than 30 German kings (from 936 to 1531). The gothic choir of the cathedral with its 27 meters high windows (1414) is a masterpiece of its time. The adjacent Treasury exhibits another 100 works of sacral art such as the famous bust of Charlemagne (approx. 1349). (www.aachendom.de)



City Hall



The City Hall, the first stop on the "Route Charlemagne", was built on the foundations of the former main hall of Charlemagne's palace. Today, it is a place of Europe's living past where you can view an interactive exhibition with the help of an "Aixplorer" audio-visual guide to get a first-hand feel for the history – past and present – of this building, the city and Europe as well. Opposite the city hall, in Haus Löwenstein, there is an exhibition on the planned "Route Charlemagne". (www.route-charlemagne.eu)

Historic Old Town

Aachen's Old Town has a lot of flair – atmospheric lanes and alleyways, numerous shops, pubs, cafés and restaurants invite visitors to stroll and window-shop. The people of Aachen and their guests enjoy the Mediterranean ambience of the city and its historic buildings and picturesque burgher houses. The spa city of Aachen is also the city of fountains and sculptures. Puppet Fountain, Chicken Thief, Fish Pond, Türelüre-Lißeje or Karls Fountain – the wide variety of Aachen fountains on their own make a rewarding tour.





Elisenbrunnen / Elisenpark



As early as Roman times, the hot thermal springs (approx. 38-74°C) have made Aachen a well-known spa for rheumatic ailments. A representation of the former glamorous spa and bathing city is the Elisa Fountain with its magnificent colonnades that was built from 1822 to 1828 according to the plans of Karl Friedrich Schinkel. Take your time to study the marble plaques with the names of the celebrities of past centuries. The 2013 opened "Archaeological Showcase" offers views into 5.000 years of Aachen's

Couven-Museum

The Couven-Museum is also called "Aachen's most famous living room". Situated in a beautiful 17th century building right in the historic centre of Aachen, it shows the development of the style of living of the 18th and 19th century. The rooms display a harmonious ensemble of several middle class furniture styles from Rococo to the early Classicism of Louis-Seize, the Napoleonic empire style and Biedermeier. 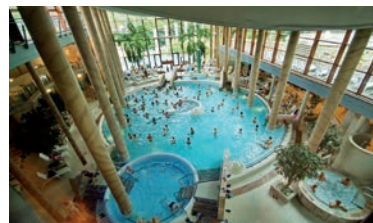
International Newspaper Museum
