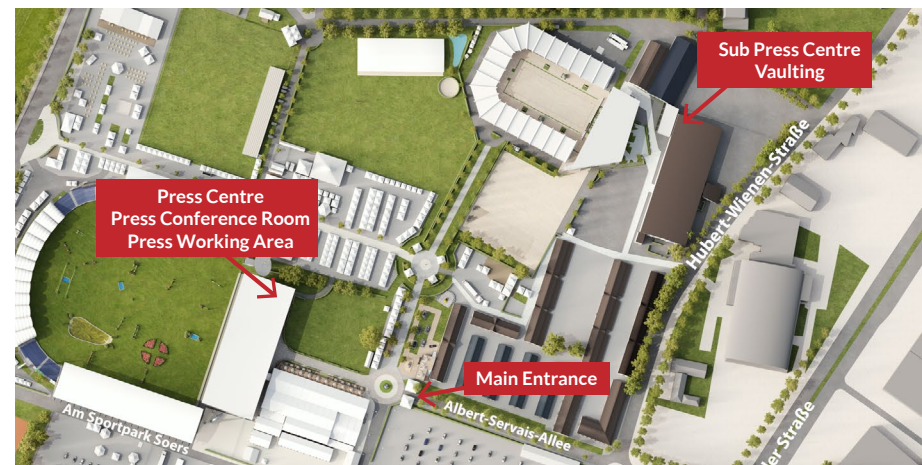

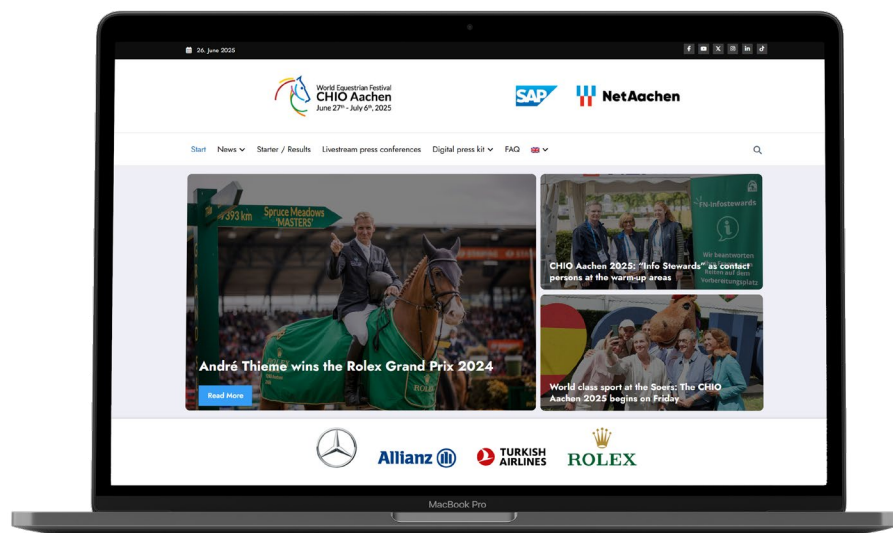

Note for photographers

CHIO Aachen Photographers and Videographers

The permanent photographers of the CHIO Aachen are Arnd Bronkhorst, Andreas Steindl, Jasmin Metzner, Diana Wahl and Leonie Minten.

Photographer Bibs

People wearing a photographer bib are allowed to stand inside the stadium after consultation with the photographer coordinator. The bib can be collected from the Counter of the Press Centre on request following a rotation principle in exchange for a deposit of 20 Euros. No entitlement to a bib exists.

Photographer Positions

The photographer positions will be laid down in consultation with the technical delegates and the course builders. The photographer positions will be posted on the notice boards in the Press Centre prior to the competitions.

Prize-Giving Ceremonies

The barriers inside the stadium are not allowed to be passed during any of the prize-giving ceremonies. The instructions of the press team must be obeyed by at all times.

Cross-Country Day

There are selected photographer positions on the track on the cross-country day. Photographers wearing bibs are allowed to move around on the outer perimeter of the track.

Ban on radio triggers without a CE label.

The use of radio triggers (so-called pocket wizards) WITHOUT a CE label is forbidden in Germany.

Use of remote cameras

The use of remote cameras will only be approved after prior consultation with the course designer. Only a very limited number of remote cameras will be approved, cameras with sound insulation will be given preference.

The table workstations can be reserved with name tags. Reservations in the press centre are made exclusively by the press counter team.

Press Stands

You can reach the press stand in the Main Stadium directly from the Press Centre. The press seats in all three stadiums and the Albert-Vahle-Arena are marked with "Press/Media" signs.

Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping

The Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping is unique in the world. Its concept: Spectacular. Ultimate. Incomparable. It combines the Majors in 's-Hertogenbosch (NED), Aachen (GER), Spruce Meadows (CAN) and Geneva (SUI) into one competition for the most prestigious trophy in international equestrian sport. Four superlative tournaments, four epic arenas full of tradition, a great challenge - all aimed at the best riders and horses in the world. Whoever triumphs at three tournaments in a row wins the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping and, in addition to the prize money, one million euros. Scott Brash (GBR) has gone down in history as the first and so far only Grand Slam winner: He won in Geneva in 2014 as well as in Aachen and Calgary in 2015. 'Winning the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping was an incredible moment in my career,' said the 38-year-old looking back. "My feelings and emotions when I held the trophy in my hands can hardly be described in words."



What is a dream come true for Scott Brash is a great incentive for his world-class colleagues. With his ground-breaking triumph, the Brit has proven to the world that winning the Rolex Grand Slam is possible. But all those athletes who have since tried to follow in the British rider's footsteps have had to experience first-hand just how difficult the battle for the show jumping crown is. Big names such as Henrik von Eckermann (SWE), Marcus Ehning (GER) and Daniel Deußner (GER) or the two Swiss riders Martin Fuchs and Steve Guerdat have gradually joined the select ranks of Major winners. Now, in the year 2025, the world's elite will once again gather in Aachen to face this ultimate challenge. For the riders and their horses, who are on the entry list for this year's CHIO Aachen, it means: full concentration on the here and now. Because only 40 starting places are available for the Rolex Grand Prix on the final Sunday - a day on which the Main Stadium, filled to the last seat, will witness sporting history. Who will be crowned Queen or King of the Aachen Soers? Who will fulfil their biggest dream this year and come one step closer to the most coveted trophy in international show jumping? The answer to this question will be revealed on 6th July in Aachen's legendary Main Stadium - full of excitement and emotion. Look forward to an unforgettable, thrilling leg of the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping - at the CHIO Aachen 2025!

German Youth Championships 2025

The equestrian stars of tomorrow will be competing here: From 21st to 24th August, the young German riders will be able to get a taste of the championships in the dressage and jumping disciplines on the grounds of the CHIO Aachen. As part of the German Youth Championships, the best talents will compete in four age groups at the traditional showgrounds in Aachen's Soers - from the Children (U14) to the Young Riders (U21).

Aachen Youngstars 2025

For more than 30 years, the best young show-jumpers have been welcomed to the Aachen Soers at the end of the year. Here, they battle it out for the victories in the Grand Prix and to claim the title of Indoor Champion in four age groups.



In 2017, the organisers extended the show calendar for the young athletes to include a further spectacular weekend. In the scope of the "Aachen Dressage Youngstars" an international dressage show for young dressage riders has been initiated, which once again this year together with the "Aachen Jumping Youngstars" forms the "Aachen Youngstars".

The best German show-jumpers will kick off the event from November 27th – November 30th. The international dressage talents will then have the opportunity to demonstrate their skills one week later from December 4th – 7th, 2025.

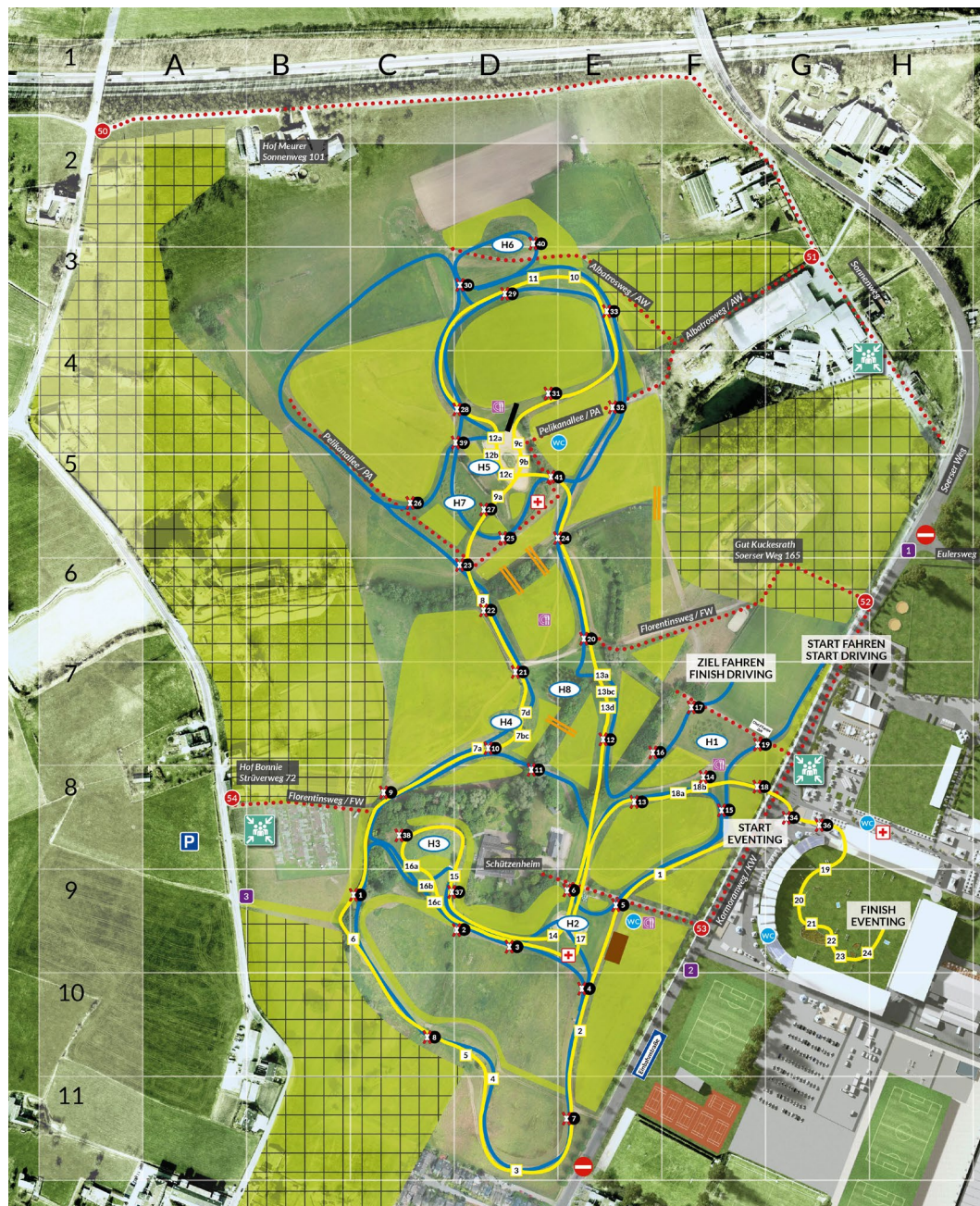

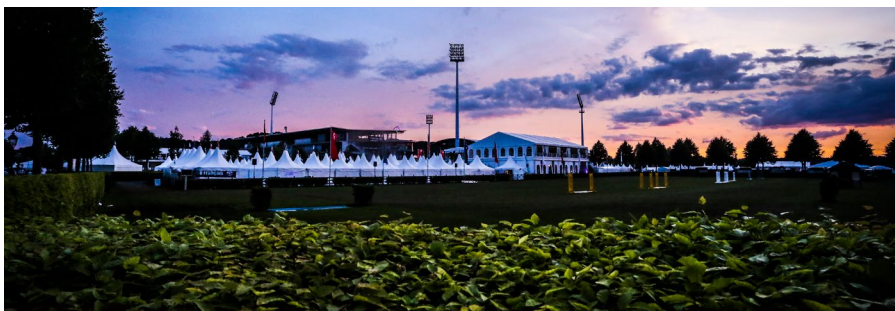

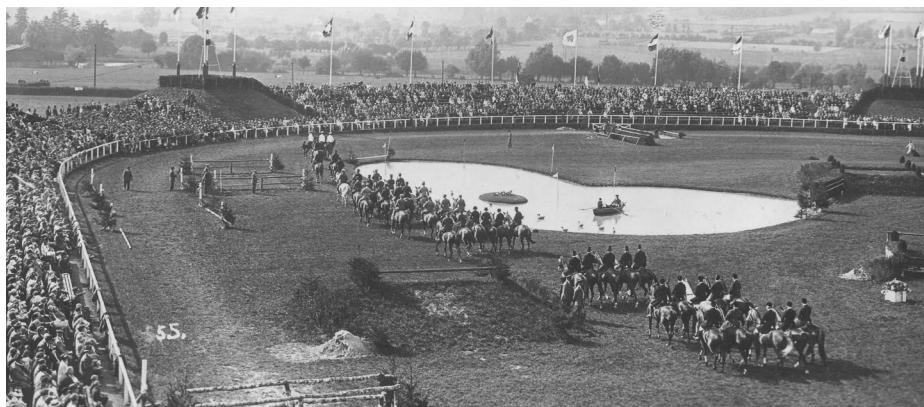

The History of the Aachen-Laurensberger Rennverein e.V. and its events



- 1898 Foundation of the „Laurensberger Rennverein e.V.“ by Arnold Deden, Gustav Rensing, Hubert Wienen as well as some farmers and merchants from the surrounding region
- 1923 The name of the association is changed to „Aachen-Laurensberger Rennverein e.V.“
- 1924 First „Riding and Driving Event“ together with flat and hurdle races in the Soers
- 1925 Large equestrian tournament on the occasion of the 1000th Anniversary of the Rhineland
- 1927 First international „Riding, Jumping and Driving Event“ with 8 participating nations
- 1937/1938 Building of the stables
- 1939 Shortly before the outbreak of the II. World War 19 nations participate at the event
- 1940-1945 No equestrian events take place. 1940 the ALRV provides the facilities to the Red Cross. The facilities are almost completely destroyed by bomb attacks
- 1945 Reconstruction of the show grounds
- 1946 Organisation of a Horse Festival with 7 competitions and 15.000 spectators in the provisional stadium
- 1947 Resumption of the international tournament, six nations participate
- 1953 At the „Farewell of Nations“ the custom of waving a white handkerchief is initiated, which has been maintained until today
- 1955 Building of a new main tribune
World Jumping Championships with 55.000 spectators
- 1956 World Jumping Championships with 14 nations
- 1957 18 nations and 175.000 spectators at the event
- 1958 European Jumping Championships
- 1960 21 nations and 175.000 spectators at the event

- 1975-1992 Extension of the show grounds through „Gut Heumesser“
Systematic development of the entire show grounds, which cover 2400 acres
- 1975 Foundation of the private limited company Aachener Reitturnier GmbH (ART) for the marketing of the CHIO Aachen
- 1978 Building of the Albert-Vahle-Halle (indoor arena), World Jumping Championships
- 1983 European Dressage Championships
- 1985 Reconstruction of judges' tower, erection of further buildings and improvement to the facility
- 1986 World Jumping Championships
- 1997 60th CHIO Aachen. 216.000 spectators in the stadium and 35.000 in the forest of Aachen
- 1998 Anniversary Event on the occasion of the 100th Anniversary of the Aachen-Laurensberger Rennverein e.V. Introduction of the first annual logo for the CHIO Edition
- 1999 Construction of the new Dressage Stadium is completed
Introduction of the „Soers Sunday“ as family day on the Sunday before the beginning of the CHIO Aachen
Introduction of the „Silver Camera“ - Award for the best equestrian photograph of the year
Begin of the project „Garden Eden“ - to make the show grounds greener
- 2000 Rebuilding of the Judges' Tower
First „Dressage-Radio“- headsets with expert comments to the dressage competitions for the spectators in the Dressage Stadium
- 2001 „The Silver Horse“ -Media Award- of the German Riders and Drivers Association (DRFV) returns to Aachen and is awarded together with „The Silver Camera“
For the first time, the CHIO Aachen presents a partner country: Under the motto „Viva España“, representatives of Spain visit Aachen. Among others, also the Royal Spanish Riding School presents colourful performances
- 2002 Rebuilding of the STAWAG Grand Stand
Partner Country Netherlands: Traditional Dutch horse breeds and carriages from the Dutch Royalty as essential parts of the show programme
Application for the World Equestrian Games (WEG) 2006 in co-operation with the German Equestrian Federation (FN); the FEI awards the organisation of the World Championships in seven disciplines to Aachen



- 2003 Hungary is the official CHIO partner country: A colourful survey of Hungary's horse history, from Hungarian horsebreeding and the husars over to the racy "Hungarian Post"
For the first time, the evening show "Horse & Symphony" is staged in co-operation with the Theatre of Aachen
Presentation of the official logo of the FEI World Equestrian Games Aachen 2006 in the course of the official opening ceremony
- 2004 The Normandy is the official partner region 2004: Norman riders and horses of the worldfamous Northern-French breed
Extension/modernisation of the show grounds for the FEI World Equestrian Games Aachen 2006 begins in July. Until August 2005, a new Riders' Grand Stand, a Judges' Tower, additional stables, a veterinary centre, and cross country-routes for Eventing, Endurance and Driving are completed. After the completion of the construction works, Aachen's Soers is the world's most modern horsesport facility
- 2005 First CHIO on the new show grounds, 336,300 visitors, partner country is Austria, show highlights are the Viennese Spanish Riding School and the famous Vienna Boys' Choir
New cross country-routes the FEI World Equestrian Games Aachen 2006 are completed, test events for endurance in June, Eventing in September
Renewal of the footing in the Main Stadium
- 2006 Reduced duration of the CHIO (May) due to the WEG in August. Five instead of six days, no side events like the "Soers Sunday" or "Horse and Symphony". Instead, for the first time in the course of the CHIO, vaulting competitions are carried out. 222,500 spectators
May until August: Final construction works previous to the WEG. Removal of the earth wall behind the Western Tribune of Stadium 1, installation of floodlight in Stadium 1, solid Judges' Tower for Stadium 2, construction of temporary tribunes in Stadium 2, temporary roof for the Dressage Stadium.
FEI World Equestrian Games Aachen 2006, August 20th - September 3rd
800 athletes and their horses fight for 16 gold medals in seven disciplines (Jumping, Dressage, Eventing, Driving, Endurance, Vaulting, Reining). 576,000 spectators in the mostly sold-out stadiums and 1.6 billion TV viewers worldwide follow the Championships. With hindsight, experts comment that the WEG Aachen 2006 has led the equestrian sport into a new dimension
- 2007 Due to the positive public response to eventing and vaulting during the WEG Aachen 2006, the two disciplines are added to the CHIO's traditional disciplines jumping, dressage and driving. First floodlight competitions in the course of the CHIO due to the success in the course of the WEG (Mercedes-Benz Nations' Cup on Thursday evening as well as an evening event on Saturday). First eventing cross-country and driving marathon competitions in the Soers, in walking distance to the showgrounds. 338,500 spectators, CHIO partner country is Portugal
- 2008 For the first time in more than 40 years, ten event days instead of six (vaulting on the first weekend, the other four disciplines in the following week. 357.250 spectators, Russia is partner country of the CHIO Aachen
- 2009 CHIO partner country is Flanders, 358,900 visitors on ten tournament days

- 2010 The CHIO-Museum (opened in 2007) is enhanced through the "History Tour", a documentation of the building/infrastructure history of the show grounds
A solid TV studio is built beneath the Judges' Tower in co-operation of the ALRV/ WDR
Aachen is an FEI test event for new dressage judging systems
After 17 years in office, ALRV-President Klaus Pavel is succeeded by Carl Meulenbergh
The German Youth championships are organized in Aachen in the three disciplines: jumping, dressage and vaulting
- 2011 Relaunch of the CHIO's website www.chioaachen.com; introduction of the Press Intranet
Italy is partner country of the CHIO Aachen 2011, presents itself with a delegation of 70 horses and 80 persons
- 2012 CHIO iPad App and 3D-Ticketing as the new milestones of the digital innovation measures
June: The FEI European Championships 2015 are allocated to Aachen
Partner of the CHIO Aachen 2012 is Rio de Janeiro, over 200 Samba dancers and 100 horses (e.g. Mangalarga Marchadores und Criollos) represent the region in the show programme
- 2013 Aachen becomes part of the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping. In conjunction with the shows in Spruce Meadows (Canada) and Geneva (Switzerland), the World Equestrian Festival, CHIO Aachen, launches the "Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping".
The new designed CHIO Aachen App for Smartphones and WLAN on the whole show ground as a new milestone for the digital innovation initiative
- 2014 The Dressage Stadium has been augmented with the East Grand Stand adding another 1,200 seats to the capacity. Furthermore, the seating shells have been renewed. As well as new Training Arenas and a Mixed-Zone "Riders' Plaza"
Besides the modernisation of the Dressage Stadium the digital area, e.g. the CHIO Aachen App or the digital CHIO Village, has been updated and extended by some new features
- 2015 May: The World Equestrian Festival is taking place in a reduced format due to the European Championships. Consistent investments were also made in the digital further development of the show in 2015. A virtual stadium, app, multimedia graphics and many other features turn the traditional show into one of the most modern major sporting events
The CHIO Aachen show ground has been expanded. A new stable and a covered training area have been built
In August the ALRV organizes the European Championships in five disciplines (Jumping, Dressage, Driving, Vaulting, Reining)
- 2016 Sweden is the CHIO partner country in 2016
Royal flair: The Swedish royal family are guests at the CHIO Aachen 2016
Queen Silvia and King Carl XVI Gustav of Sweden open the World Equestrian Festival
Great joy among the crowd in Aachen, for the first time in seven years the German team wins the Mercedes-Benz Nations' Cup



- 2017 The Netherlands are the CHIO partner country in 2017
For the first time at CHIO Aachen: CIAT - Traditional Driving Event
Online Stars are reporting from the CHIO Aachen Blogger Lounge
- 2018 China is the CHIO Aachen partner country in 2018
The Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping is expanded to include the Dutch Masters in 's-Hertogenbosch. Now altogether there are four legs of the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping
The „digital CHIO Aachen“ is being extended, the scope of the reporting via Social Media is being broadened
- 2019 France is official partner country of the CHIO Aachen 2019.
CIAT - Traditional Driving Event
Concert "Horse & Symphony" on Friday, July 12th, and Saturday, July 13th, 2019.
CHIO Aachen blogger lounge: well-known (equestrian) blogger came to the CHIO Aachen Village
- 2020 CHIO Aachen could not take place due to COVID-19.
- 2021 Japan is official partner country of the CHIO Aachen 2021
Due to COVID-19 the CHIO Aachen could not take place on its original date June 25th – July 4th. A new date was approved for September 10th – 19th.
- 2022 After two years of Corona Pandemic, this year the CHIO Aachen 2022 can take place again under "normal conditions" under the motto "Welcome to the Festival!".
As a replacement for the Youth Olympic Games, the FEI Youth Equestrian Games will be held within the framework of the CHIO Aachen 2022 (June 24th – July 3rd, 2022).
- 2023 CHIO Aachen Partner Country 2023 is Great Britain
Royal flair: Her Royal Highness, Princess Anne opens the World Equestrian Festival
Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping celebrates 10th anniversary
- 2024 The partnership between the CHIO Aachen and the United States is embedded in the celebrations for the NRW-USA Year 2023/2024, which honours the shared history of the USA and North Rhine-Westphalia.

People and Horses

- According to a study conducted by market research company IPSOS in 2019, around 11.2 million respondents stated that they were interested in horses and equestrian sports. However, only over 14-year-olds were surveyed. The study also determined the number of equestrian sports enthusiasts in Germany: 2.32 million people describe themselves as riders*, including 840,000 regularly active riders and 1.48 million occasional riders. 700,000 people would like to ride or get back into the sport.
- Furthermore, there are around 600,000 households in Germany that own horses as well as 920,000 households with a horse-sharing participation. According to projections, the number of horses privately-owned is around 1.25 million. Just under a third are kept privately, the majority (around 45 percent) are kept in livery stables. The remainder live on farms without a riding area or indoor arena.

* The term rider always includes riders, vaulters and all persons who are actively involved with the horse in any way, e.g. in the form of ground work.

- According to the IPSOS survey, regularly active riders are predominantly female (78 percent), on average 38 years old, well-educated and mostly work full-time or at least part-time. For most people, the close relationship to the horse and the closeness to nature are their reasons for riding. Most riders live in towns with less than 100,000 inhabitants. The smallest share lives in big cities. The net household income is in some cases significantly lies over the German average.

Organised Horse Sport in Germany

The following figures apply for the year 2023:

- The German Equestrian Federation (Fédération Equestre Nationale, FN), the national umbrella organisation for equestrian sport, is the world's largest equestrian sports association. Within the German Olympic Sports Confederation (DOSB), the FN ranks ninth with 663,145 members (previous year: 664,919).
- Equestrian sport is very popular with women. A total of 534,705 FN members are girls and women. With 128,432 boys and men, the male share is just under 20 per cent.
- The state association of Baden-Württemberg has the most club members with 97,102 (previous year: 97,094), followed by Westphalia with 95,175 (previous year: 95,95,890), Bavaria with 86,268 (previous year: 85,491), Hanover with 77,935 (previous year: 78,944), Hesse with 68,907 (previous year: 69,109) and Rhineland with 57,332 (57,199). If Westphalia and the Rhineland were added together, North Rhine-Westphalia would have 152,507 club members and Lower Saxony (Hanover, Bremen and Weser-Ems) 124,433.

Organisational Structure of the German Equestrian Federation (FN)

- The German Equestrian Federation (FN), as the umbrella organisation, is made up of 17 state equestrian associations with 7,198 riding and driving clubs (previous year: 7,278). The breeding sector includes 25 German breeding associations, 15 of which specialise in warmblood breeding.
- In addition, 3,347 equestrian businesses (previous year 3,389) and 57,163 (previous year 56,960)



personal members are directly affiliated to the FN (or its member associations).

- Other FN member associations include the German Olympic Committee for Equestrian Sports (DOKR), the German Riders' and Drivers' Association and the German Judges' Association for Horse Performance Tests. There are also nine affiliated organisations: First Western Riders' Union Germany, Iceland Horse, Rider and Breeder Association, German Endurance Riders' and Drivers' Association, German Board of Trustees for Therapeutic Riding, German Academic Riders' Association, International Gaited Horse Association, Federal Association for Classical-Baroque Riding Germany, German Stallion Owners' Association and the German Young Breeders' Association.

Competition Sport

- In 2023, 3,428 tournament events were held (previous year: 3,562) with 58,084 competitions (previous year: 59,054) and 1,104,836 starts (previous year: 1,111,842). The cash prizes totalled €30,434,64 in 2023 (previous year: €29,928,312). In comparison, in 2019, before the coronavirus pandemic, there were 3,567 tournaments with 66,281 competitions and around 1.34 million starts.
- In 2023, the FN issued 69,635 annual tournament licences entitling riders to participate in tournaments (previous year: 71,831), including 1,471 licences for foreign riders (previous year: 1,442) who took part in German tournaments. Before coronavirus, there were 80,342 annual tournament licences. In addition, 4,806 young people and adults found their way into competition sport via so-called trial licences (previous year: 5,230, 2019: 6,077).
- In 2023, the FN made 118,129 updates for competition horses and ponies (previous year: 120,453, 2019: 132,257) and 2,888 FEI passports for internationally competing competition horses (previous year: 2,929, 2019: 2,572). The number of horses and ponies newly entered in the show horse register totalled 22,272, compared to 22,654 horses and ponies in the previous year.
- The proportion of older horses in the sport has risen steadily in recent years. 11.34 per cent (previous year: 10.93%, 2019: 9.86%) are over 16 years old. However, the majority of all competition horses - 51.18 per cent (previous year: 50.38%) - are between five and ten years old, while 28.75 per cent (previous year: 29.35%) are between eleven and 15 years old. Compared to the previous year, the proportion of younger horses in the sport has fallen further: 8.73 per cent (previous year: 9.15%), but is still just above the proportion in 2019, when 8.08 per cent of show horses were three- and four-year-olds.

German Horse Breeding

- German riding horse and riding pony breeding plays a major role in the success of German equestrian sport.
- In 2023, 2,839 stallions (previous year: 2,973), 52,276 broodmares (previous year: 54,041) and 28,600 foals (previous year: 28,173) were registered in German riding horse breeding. The number of coverings fell from 30,654 in 2022 to a total of 26,808.
- In addition, a total of 3,700 pony and small horse stallions of all breeds (previous year: 3,815), 20,987 pony and small horse broodmares (previous year: 21,089) and 9,847 foals (previous year: 10,498) were registered with the associations in 2023.
- For all horse and pony breeds of the 25 breeding associations affiliated with the FN (from Achal Tekkiner to Warlander), the following numbers of breeding animals were reported in 2023: 7,829 stallions (previous year: 8,219), 81,457 broodmares (previous year: 83,855) and 42,082 foals (previous year: 40,320).

- In 2023, 373 young stallions competed in the stallion performance test for riding horses (2022: 459). Changes to the stallion performance test concept lead to a reduction by around half in the number of 75 stallions that tested in 14-day VA (short) performance tests in 2023, while the proven sport tests and 50-day performance tests continued to enjoy undiminished popularity. A total of 197 (2022: 116 participants) were counted in the sport tests and 101 (2022: 117 participants) in the 50-day station tests.
- 1,629 riding horse broodmares (previous year: 1,778) demonstrated their performance in station and field tests. A total of 2,372 broodmares (previous year: 2,563) demonstrated their performance in station and field tests.

Horses – The Economic Factor

- Over 10,000 companies, handicraft businesses and service companies in Germany are directly or indirectly dependent on the horse as their main line of business.
- The turnover of the German horse industry lies at an estimated 6.7 billion Euros. The area horse keeping accounts for 39 percent of the expenditure (2.6 bil. Euros), the area retail trade and services account for 61 percent (4.1 bil. Euros).
- At the riding horse auctions organised by the breeding associations in 2023, 672 riding horses were auctioned off at an average price of 27,205 euros (previous year: 756 riding horses, average price 28,735 euros). Furthermore, around 2,261 breeding horses, foals and ponies (previous year: 1,789 ponies and cold-blooded horses) were auctioned off at the breeding associations' auctions.



The City of Aachen

Aachen without horses? Unthinkable.

The horse belongs to Aachen like the port does to Hamburg, like the Brandenburger Tor does to Berlin. The foundation of the city goes back to a horse. In Aachen this can, of course, only have been the horse of Charlemagne. It is said that his horse once pawed the earth with his hoof and thereby discovered the famous hot Aachen springs during a hunting trip. This was the beginning of Aachen's career as Charlemagne's favourite palace and as a spa and bathing city.

The people in Aachen call such stories „Ameröllche“. When they talk about the famous annual horse show at the city's gates in the Soers, they say „Tschio“. If you pronounced the tournament's title correctly you would say „C - H - I - O“. The „Concours Hippique International Officiel" is the world's most renowned equestrian event. Every year the world's best riders and drivers meet in the Soers to compete in front of an audience of more than 350,000 visitors. The show is famous for its extraordinarily fair and euphoric audience, the top level sport and its atmosphere which is similar to a folk festival.



The City of Aachen

But Aachen is associated with much more than only top international horse sport. Almost 150 equestrian companies, 22 indoor arenas, dozens of riding clubs and over 40 kilometres of riding tracks form a perfect infrastructure for riding as popular sport within the city's environs. So it is not a surprise that Aachen, situated in the border triangle with Belgium and the Netherlands, was awarded the title "Horse Friendly Community" in 2002. Aachen's high identification with the horse and equestrian sports can be found in many places in the city.

The famous horse sculpture of Bonifatius Stirnberg welcomes travellers at the main train station, and near the city theatre stands the Smiling Stallion of Gerhard Marcks. Located in the centre of Europe, the city of the International Charlemagne Prize is also a science centre of international reputation. Aachen Cathedral and Treasury

The Aachen "Dom" (Cathedral), which has been given the status of a world cultural heritage site, is the former Palace Chapel of Charlemagne. Still today, this magnificent building fascinates visitors who gaze upwards to the 32 meters high dome and admire the Barbarossa chandelier (1180), the shrines of Charlemagne and Mary (13th century) as well as the legendary throne of Charlemagne. This is the historic site of the coronation of more than 30 German kings (from 936 to 1531). The gothic choir of the cathedral with its 27 meters high windows (1414) is a masterpiece of its time. The adjacent Treasury exhibits another 100 works of sacral art such as the famous bust of Charlemagne (approx. 1349). (www.aachendom.de)



City Hall



The City Hall, the first stop on the "Route Charlemagne", was built on the foundations of the former main hall of Charlemagne's palace. Today, it is a place of Europe's living past where you can view an interactive exhibition with the help of an "Aixplorer" audio-visual guide to get a first-hand feel for the history – past and present – of this building, the city and Europe as well. Opposite the city hall, in Haus Löwenstein, there is an exhibition on the planned "Route Charlemagne". (www.route-charlemagne.eu)

Historic Old Town

Aachen's Old Town has a lot of flair – atmospheric lanes and alleyways, numerous shops, pubs, cafés and restaurants invite visitors to stroll and window-shop. The people of Aachen and their guests enjoy the Mediterranean ambience of the city and its historic buildings and picturesque burgher houses. The spa city of Aachen is also the city of fountains and sculptures. Puppet Fountain, Chicken Thief, Fish Pond, Türelüre-Liße or Karls Fountain – the wide variety of Aachen fountains on their own make a rewarding tour.



Elisenbrunnen / Elisenpark



As early as Roman times, the hot thermal springs (approx. 38-74°C) have made Aachen a well-known spa for rheumatic ailments. A representation of the former glamorous spa and bathing city is the Elisa Fountain with its magnificent colonnades that was built from 1822 to 1828 according to the plans of Karl Friedrich Schinkel. Take your time to study the marble plaques with the names of the celebrities of past centuries. The 2013 opened "Archaeological Showcase" offers views into 5.000 years of Aachen's

Couven-Museum

The Couven-Museum is also called "Aachen's most famous living room". Situated in a beautiful 17th century building right in the historic centre of Aachen, it shows the development of the style of living of the 18th and 19th century. The rooms display a harmonious ensemble of several middle class furniture styles from Rococo to the early Classicism of Louis-Seize, the Napoleonic empire style and Biedermeier. International Newspaper Museum



The International Newspaper Museum newly opened in 2011: the Newspaper Museum occupies an imposing 15th century house and is home to one of the 21st century's most up-to-the-minute international media presentations. It vividly conveys media literacy in a contemporary style, showing approximately 200,000 newspapers published over a period of 500 years. (www.izm.de)
